



# **EDITORIAL**

# **ROSETTA**

For those that don't know, the European space probe Rosetta made an historic rendezvous with Comet 67P on Wednesday last week, after travelling in space for 10 years and covering a distance of some 6 billion kilometres. Last week it was within 100 kilometres of the comet which is travelling at 55,000 kilometres per hour and the intention is to land a tiny robotic lab on the irregularly shaped (surprisingly) comet which is about 3 km's by 5km's. The lab will be the first to land on a comet and will give insight into how planets, including the Earth, formed 4.6 billion years ago.

Imagine all this and our country is still debating whether or not Mathematics should be a compulsory subject at schools!!

To get to where it is Rosetta has had to make 4 flybys of Mars and Earth, using their gravitation as a slingshot to build up speed. It then went into hibernation for 31 months because the light from the distant sun had become too weak to power its solar panels. It was 'awakened' again in January and the 3 ton craft is now positioned to allow the lab to dock with

the comet and stay with it for months ahead. On November 11th, the plan is for Rosetta to get within a few kilometres of the comet and send down a 100Kg refrigerator sized robot laboratory, Philae.

Anchored to the surface, Philae will carry out experiments in cometary chemistry and texture for up to 6 months. After the lander expires, Rosetta will accompany the comet as it passes around the sun and heads out towards the orbit of Jupiter.

Last month, as Rosetta came even closer to the comet, its cameras revealed that the target comet, far from being shaped like a potato as many expected, it rather resembled a duck. This is expected to limit the choice of a landing site and will probably also impose additional constraints.

All of this, at great cost, to try and better understand the formation of the planets 4.6 billion years ago.
