

However, as mentioned, the failures are the interesting ones.

In 1859 associates of Edwin L Drake replied to his suggestion to drill for oil: "Drill for oil? You mean drill into the ground to try and find oil? You're crazy!"

In 1873 Sir John Ericksen, a British surgeon appointed as Surgeon – Extraordinaire' to Queen Victoria announced that no surgeon will ever operate on the heart or brain :- "The abdomen, the chest, and the brain will forever be shut from the intrusion of the wise and humane surgeon."

Or how about the electric light presented with much fanfare at the Paris Exhibition received the comment from Oxford Professor Erasmus Wilson "When the Paris Exhibition closes, electric light will close with it, and no more will be heard of it." (Did Eskom know something?)

Unfortunately even Lord Kelvin, President of the Royal Society and a scientific pioneer was led astray in 1883, with "X-rays will prove to be a hoax".

Flight has always been a dream of mankind. As a pre-cursor to commercial flights to the moon (and lower places) we have Professor Joseph le Conte reporting in Popular Science Monthly in 1888 "Is it not demonstrated that a true flying machine, self-raising, self sustaining, self propelling, is physically impossible?"



My personal favourite is now widely recognised as a mis-quote, though there are variations by other leading figures that have been confirmed. The mis-quote is by Tom Watson the then CEO of IBM, who is reputed to have said in +- 1948: "I think there is a world market for maybe five computers". It would be a weird conclusion by a man who led IBM to the world force it became.
