

EDITORIAL

IOC DEMANDS SMILES AND RIDICULOUS PERKS AHEAD OF 2022 OLYMPIC BID

The Olympic Games at Lillehammer, Norway, in 1994 was a great success. When discussions started about bidding for the 2022 Games to take place in Oslo, many thought this was a brilliant idea. A referendum in 2013 showed a majority of 55% supportive of submitting a bid.

However, Oslo will not be hosting the 2022 Olympic and Para-Olympic Games. One of the reasons is that US\$5.4 billion is far too much money to spend on a project, according to the Norwegian Prime Minister.

Also, when the requirements of the International Olympic Committee were presented, it shocked the Norwegians. 7,000 pages of requirements, which mostly concerned safety, also included ridiculous demands as part of the bid.

First the IOC members wanted to meet the king prior to the opening ceremony.

It also wanted free cocktail parties with the King.

Cars and drivers for all IOC members

Special traffic lanes for IOC members, not to be used by regular people.

"IOC members will be received with a smile on arrival at hotel"

Hotel bars must be open "extra late" and can only serve Coca-Cola products.

All conference rooms must be kept at exactly 68 degrees F.

All furniture should be OL-shaped and have Olympic appearance

Schools and some work places should be closed to increase attendance at the games, and people were encouraged to take their annual leave during the Games.

Special VIP lounges at every arena for IOC members, and these ones must have good views, be of a specific size and serve high quality and varied food, which required special kitchens to be built.

The IOC members wanted to be able to have all purchases tax free, which would have resulted in Norway having to introduce a new law.

All public advertising space in Oslo should be made available for IOC sponsors.

This was enough for the Norwegian government, and the bid was withdrawn.

So far Stockholm in Sweden, Krakow in Poland and Lviv in Ukraine have all pulled their bids. The only remaining bidders left are Almaty in Kazakhstan and Beijing in China.

At the same time, it appears that IOC is now building an enormous centre in Switzerland.

GUEST SPEAKER:

Former member of Cape Town Rotary Club, Jimmy Baigrie has spent the past 12 years as the key fund raising figure in the Zeekoevlei Yacht Club/Wynberg Rotary Club Development Sailing programme, initiated by the late Ken O'Brien, Gordon Knight and John Vivian.

The early days were spent in Saldanha trainers and old, donated Sonnets in varying condition. However when Old Mutual came up with a 3 year funding offer of R250 000 per year, the sailing programme flourished with new, international 420 and Tera class boats. Graduate sailors were sent to compete in regattas – not just locally, but overseas – coming home with enviable medals from their successes. 60-80 children per week from 8 schools in Grassy Park schools are taken to Zeekoevlei and back again to their schools by taxi every afternoon. Graduates are paid to instruct new students in the art of sailing.

However funding has become scarce and the academy has had to downscale while they look for a new sponsor. Although not excessive, there are ongoing expenses: Coaching costs R9 000 and transport for the students runs at about R5 000 per month, for the effective 8 months sailing season. Away regattas are a further R210 000 per year; and they need a new rescue boat.....

Marco, a sailing novice from inception, progressed to being a Cape-to-Rio participant, holds a senior position with the Metropolitan Life Group and now heads up the sailing academy.....
