Editorial

Gas to Europe


During the recent visit by some of our members to Norway Odd Henning Johannessen once again managed to come up with something in our program that, for me who has visited a number of times, was different and highly interesting.

In 2001 GASSCO was formed for the commercial transport of natural gas to Europe. Coming from platforms in the North Sea, gas is transported through a labyrinth of 7,928 Kilometres of mostly underwater pipelines to 2 processing plants in Norway where it is blended according to user requirements and then 'delivered' through terminals in Europe – 2 each in the U.K. and Germany and 1 each in France and Belgium.

Head office is situated a short way outside of Kopervik, which is where we went for our visit. Only 362 skilled employees operate this highly sophisticated network. We were taken to an observation area overlooking the control room where 3 operators monitor computer screens (huge) and are responsible for order taking, liaising with platforms and processing plants to control the inflow of gasses from platforms for blending the gases to meet the specifications according to each customer requirement, liaising with the processing plants and controlling the outflow of gas to terminals in the countries mentioned.

The unfortunately poor reproduction quality of the network is illustrated
