Rotary contributes R585 000 to Learn to Earn's Ground UP Academy

In partnership with the <u>Tavistock Rotary Club</u>, Devon UK; Rotary Districts 1175 & 9350 and <u>Rotary International</u> Foundation, the Rotary Club of Wynberg hosted a Project Launch on Thursday 28 September 2017 for the benefit of <u>Learn to Earn South Africa</u> South Africa to the value of R585 000. These funds will be used for capacity building and training of unemployed adults as baristas.

In attendance at the event were the current President of Wynberg Rotary Club Rob Murphy, Past President of Tavistock Rotary Catherine Bailey; Assistant Governor Paul Stohrer; Past Wynberg Rotary Club Presidents Alan Jackson and Jackie James, Wynberg Rotary Club members Ruth and Justin Schonegevel, past member of Wynberg Rotary and Innerwheel Peter and Virginia Bailey, CEO of Learn to Earn Roche Van Wyk together with Learn to Earn staff members Robyn Anderson, Barbara Lipp and Zolani a graduate and in his 2nd year of E3 cubed programme (Enterprise Enabling Environment).

E3 cubed programme (Enterprise Enabling Environment) provides business skills training while working for <u>Ground UP</u> mobile and being mentored to run his own Ground UP mobile coffee unit. Graduates who are accepted onto this programme begin at the 'flagship' trailer at Rondebosch Boys High where they work and train until they are capable of 'graduating' to another site where they manage their own unit.

Learn to Earn's Ground UP Academy seeks to train unemployed adults in the holistic role of an entry level barista based on Learn to Earn's core values. Learn to Earn's motto is "a hand up not a hand out" and this is something that they instil in each of their graduates.

Another part of the investment is to equip two trailers with professional coffee making equipment to increase training standards, to allow more exposure of the programme and to increase training opportunities in real customer service.

These trailers are parked at key strategic venues such as schools, markets and other public events where the trainees make and sell coffee to the public.

The Rotary Club of Wynberg would like to thank the <u>Last Night of The Proms</u> audiences who helped the Club raise a large portion of this investment.


