Aubrey Michalowsky 12.02.1932 – 28.04.2018

Aubrey, who joined our club in 2000, was in charge of bursary awards for our Interact clubs for many years. He was always cheerful, helpful and kind – a dedicated doctor, a loving husband and good friend to all.

He was born in Albertinia, 12th Feb 1932, in a hotel that was owned by his parents. Once qualified at UCT Medical School in 1955, he spent some time in the USA and then worked in Oudtshoorn for 18 years. He practiced in Namaqualand, at Kleinsee, and also in the Kimberly area for 8 years. He loved being a GP and, when he moved to Cape Town, he joined Dr Cohen in Observatory and later bought the practice.

The practice was in the Main Road, Observatory and robbers looking for drugs, forced their way in and locked “Dr Mike” and his receptionist in a cupboard. He immediately decided he did not want to practice in such a vulnerable area anymore; and Rotarian Hugh gave him a consulting room in a suite at Groote Schuur Hospital, where he stayed and was well loved by the staff until his retirement.

He is survived by his wife, Adele and a daughter in Australia.



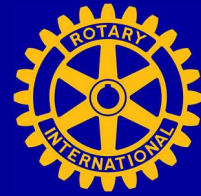

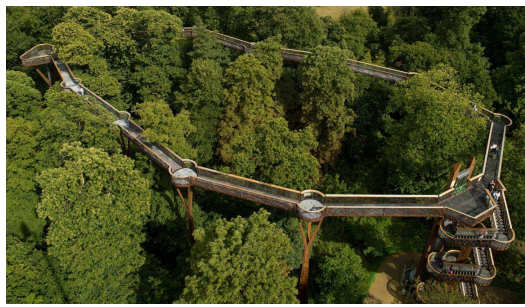

KEW GARDENS

The Treetop Walkway in Kew is 200 metres long and towers 18 metres above the ground. Made from over 400 tonnes of weathered steel, the rusted steel columns blend in with the natural environment. Visitors are enabled a rare insight into the complex ecosystem of the forest canopy, a world teeming with birds and insects, lichens and fungi.

It may be higher and longer than the Boomslang (130 m long and rising to 12 m), but the Kirstenbosch walkway, narrow and slender, lightly snakes, winds and dips its way through the canopy, in a discreet, almost invisible way. The scenery from it can't be beaten.
