

She has awakened a realisation in the young women of that country – the older ones may continue to accept the status quo - that they need not be down trodden, more so that with a high turnout at elections, they could hold real power. This should apply of course throughout the world where custom gives many women little choice but to be subservient to men.

But the world is changing, women generally outnumber men and as the principle of gender equalityhas been established in the powerful countries, pressure could be applied both internally on certain sects and externally on the grossly noncompliant nations. One exception of course would be the oil rich ones which the west will continue to woo!

In theory women could control parliaments, the world, frightening stuff.
