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

Alan introduced us to Brett Glasby, who is the SPCA Wildlife Unit Manager. With a background in zoo management, he has been with the SPCA for 4 years.

The unit was started in 2007, with the intention of providing a buffer between and the wildlife. Brett entertained us with some of the many interesting experiences he has had in that time, covering everything from spiders to whales. Some of the creatures included a seal from the Antarctic, a 5 week old honey badger which he had to hand rear, a crocodile in Parow, and Black Cobras in car engines.

They have 3 inspectors, who cover 14 000km², so fortunately they are hugely dedicated. Their new Wildlife Care facility handled 1187 animals in its first year of operation!

Bev thanked Brett for his talk, which she described as both heart warming and heart wrenching.
