EDITORIAL

About Rotary Family Health Days (RFHD)

Rotary Family Health Days is the signature program of Rotarians For Family Health & AIDS Prevention (RFHA). The program promotes healthy living and disease prevention by implementing a massive, annual campaign in four countries in Africa that provides comprehensive, free health care services tens of thousands of people in underprivileged communities.

This program is Rotary-led but leverages the power of partnerships that include The Coca-Cola Africa Foundation, the U.S. Mission – including the Centres for Disease Control, USAID and the health service delivery expertise of their Implementing Partners -- plus each of the in-country Ministers of Health (Department of Health) who provide services and supplies at the sites. Equally importantly in each country are the primary media partners that include the SABC and Caxton in South Africa, plus other media centres in each of the other countries.

Now in its fourth year, the results continue to be impressive. Wynberg, Constantia and Kromboom last year turned in one of the best results in our district. Let's go for gold again team.

Your club needs you. Please see if you can do a shift during RFHD or see how you can assist.

Last year Measurement and Evaluation of impact to prove sustainability was started and this is critical to the success of this program. This will be implemented again this year.

Rotarians For Family Health & Aids Prevention, Inc. (RFHA) was founded by Marion Bunch of The Rotary Club of Dunwoody, Georgia/USA. Marion brought a personal perspective to the battle against AIDS when she lost her son, Jerry, to this disease in 1994. Her action began in 1997 by forming a partnership with AID Atlanta (a local AIDS Service Organization) and creating an AIDS Awareness Program for Georgia's middle and high school students which is still in operation today and has reached over 500,000 students.

In 2004, the Rotary Board of Directors approved Marion's application to become an independent Rotarian Action Group that focuses on mobilizing Rotarians, partners and communities into implementing disease prevention programs - known as Rotarians for Family Health & AIDS Prevention (RFHA). Marion has now retired and her position is being filled by Alicia Michael.
