### **Spanish Wells**

Spanish Wells is one of the over 800 islands that comprise the country of the Bahamas (shallow sea). Spanish Wells is the one and only village on the island which is actually called St George's Cay. Next to this island is Russell Island and the two are joined by a narrow bridge. Spanish Wells is an affluent community, the wealth coming from lobster fishing, which takes place from November to March. The island is deeply religious. It was uninhabited 250 years ago, then a ship carrying Christian refugees from England was wrecked here and the survivors settled in and established the town and industry, fishing and tourism. Most of the families are related and the dominant surname is Pinder. Shops are closed on Sundays except the ice cream shop that opens every evening from 19.00 to 21.00. The shop makes two different flavours of ice cream each day.

There are no cars on the island, only golf carts. As the island lies in the tropics, these vehicles help you keep cool. No safety belts. All very calm and relaxed. There is an excellent supermarket which gets all its supplies from the USA by ferry once a week. Also three very good bottle stores. Prices are not exorbitant as they have to supply the locals

There are no hotels but lots of self-catering houses or cottages to hire. The island is 8Km long and 1.5Km wide on average. Russell Island is the same size. All the Bahamian Island are sand islands so each island has pure white beaches all around.

Theft is unheard of, so when you go to the beach you leave your towels and umbrellas where they are for as long as you stay. Most of the houses are on the beach, so it's only a few metres from your front door to the sea. Coconut trees are plentiful and grow right on the beach.

There are no waves, so the sea is dead calm and a very warm 29°C in winter and in the low 30s in summer. Lots of small fish swim around your feet. The water is crystal clear, so excellent for snorkelling or diving. Some of the excursions to nearby islands include swimming with dolphins and also swimming with pigs (!). Feeding the sting rays is a wonderful experience with their soft wings brushing your feet. There are three excellent pubs right over the sea and beach: Sandy Bar, Harbour Yard and The Raft.



All in all a fantastic place to take a family for a safe outdoor holiday. There are daily flights from Nassau to an adjacent, larger island and then ferry to Spanish Wells.
