A HEALTHIER, HAPPIER, PLANET

Paul Sinton-Hewitt founded parkrun in 2004. The first ever event was in Bushy Park, Teddington, UK, where 13 intrepid parkrunners got together on 2 October. Since then, the volunteer-led, free-for-all 5Km events have been taken up by many people across many cultures in many countries. They are now an international family of over 3 million parkrunners. But, of course, it was a bit more low-key at the beginning.

It took nearly two years before parkrun spread beyond Bushy. Wimbledon was the chosen venue and they had to prove to themselves that they could manage more than a single event at a time. This was the start of the fragmentation approach to events that would allow parkrun to expand.

To begin, results were collated on paper and the finish tokens were washers from the local hardware store! But eventually they ramped up the technology, and so the parkrun registration and barcode result system was born.

Now many hundreds of thousands of parkrunners are processed, websites updated and millions of emails sent each week. The parkrun community is growing all the time – but it's all still based on the simple, basic principles formed from the start: Turn up every Saturday and walk, jog or run 5Km. You can also volunteer in numerous different admin. roles. It doesn't matter how fast you go. It doesn't matter what you're wearing. What matters is taking part ("weekly, free, 5Km, for everyone, forever").

There are now parkrun events each Saturday in 20 countries all around the world. Each event is organised by a group of wonderful, dedicated, local volunteers – the hi-visibility heroes.


Paul's firm belief reflects parkrun's mission; to create a healthier, happier planet.

When I did my 100th run, there were a total of 1437 runners at Bushy Park, of which 1364 were under the age of 60. I came in number 1375 (Ah shame!).

This brings up a similarity between the Parkrun organization and the one started by another Paul.

Paul Percy Harris, a Chicago attorney, founded Rotary International in 1905. Harris organized the first Rotary Club "in fellowship and friendship" with three clients and local businessmen. His initial goal was solely to create a club of professional and businessmen for friendship and fellowship. However, he soon realized that Rotary needed a greater purpose and transformed Rotary into the world's first Service Club with, currently, about 1.2 million members worldwide.

There is a great similarity between the two Pauls, and both achieved their wish to have a positive effect on mankind throughout the world.
